






Figure 1. In this overhead view of a typical installation, satellite speakers are used to reproduce sound for the front and surround channels. The center channel reproduces sound and dialogue. The powered subwoofer provides bass for effects and music.


AEH50 BRACKET ASSEMBLY AND MOUNTING

IMPORTANT SAFETY NOTE: Proper selection of mounting hardware not included herein and proper assembly and installation of brackets, including but not limited to selection of appropriate weight bearing support and bracket use with the specified speaker only is the exclusive responsibility of the customer. Manufacturer disclaims any liability for the selection of mounting hardware and or bracket installation.

- a. Loosen and remove the molded nut (2) by turning it counter clockwise. Use the supplied metal bar (5) if necessary by inserting it in one of the holes on the molded nut (2).
- b. Pull the ball/shaft (3) out of the wall bracket (4).
- c. Slide the molded nut (2) onto the ball/shaft (3) with threaded opening facing the ball, and thread on the metal nut (1) all the way onto the ball/shaft (3), with the nut (1)'s "knurled" surface facing away from the ball.
- d. Screw on the ball/shaft
 (3) into the threaded insert on the back of the speaker until it is fully seated against the bottom of the insert.

- (1) using a crescent wrench until it is firmly seated against the back of the speaker and has fully locked the ball/shaft (3) and the speaker cabinet together. Please note that once this nut is tightened, it may embed some marks on the back of the speaker where the attachment is made. However, these marks will be covered by the nut (1).
- f. Mount the wall bracket (4) onto a wood stud on the wall, using #10, minimum 1 inch long, wood screws. Make sure that all 4 screws are driven into the stud and not in drywall. If the bracket needs to be mounted on drywall, the use of properly selected and installed wallanchors and screws is essential.

- e. Tighten the "knurled" nut (1) using a crescent wrench until it is firmly seated against the back of the speaker and has e. Holding the speaker with both hands, reinsert the ball portion of the ball/shaft (3) into the wall bracket (4).
 - Hand tighten the molded nut (2) while positioning the speaker for the intended orientation.
 - . Once the orientation of the speaker is finalized, use the metal bar (5) in one of the holes on the molded nut (2) and tighten securely.



PLACEMENT

NOTE: The satellite speakers can be placed directly on a shelf, or mounted on a wall using the included wall brackets.

LEFT AND RIGHT FRONT CHANNELS

For left and right front channels, place one satellite to the left and another to the right of the television, as shown in Figure 1. Since the speakers are magnetically shielded, you can place them very close to the TV

CENTER CHANNEL

For the center channel, place the speaker directly on top of, or below, your television. Use included brackets for wall mounting.

SURROUND CHANNELS

For left and right surround channels, place one speaker on the left and another on the right, to the side of or slightly behind the listening area. The surround speakers

SUBWOOFER

Since the installation of a subwoofer can be somewhat more complicated than installing full-range speakers, it is essential that you read this section very carefully prior to connecting the subwoofer to your system. Should you have questions relating to installation, it is advisable to call either your dealer or Leviton's Technical Support Department for advice.

The performance of the subwoofer is directly related to its placement in the listening room and how you align the subwoofer with the satellite speakers. Setting the volume of the subwoofer in relation to the left and right speakers is also of critical importance because it is essential that the subwoofer integrate smoothly with the entire system. Setting the subwoofer's volume level too high will result in an overpowering, boomy bass. Setting the volume level too low will negate the benefits of the subwoofer.

Here are several additional facts on installation that may prove useful. It is generally believed that low frequencies (below 125Hz) are nondirectional and, therefore, placement of a subwoofer within any listening room is not critical. While in theory it is true that the larger wavelengths of extremely low frequencies are basically nondirectional,

the fact is that, when installing a subwoofer within the limited confines of a room, reflections, standing waves and absorptions generated within the room will strongly influence the performance of any subwoofer system. As a result, specific location of the subwoofer becomes important, and we strongly recommend that you experiment with placement before choosing a final location. Placement will depend upon your room (for example, whether or not your room permits placement of the subwoofer near either satellite) and the amount and quality of bass required.

WALL-MOUNTING THE SATELLITES

The satellites are designed to be mounted on the wall. There is a wall bracket for each satellite speaker. Each speaker bracket will require (4) 1-1/2,"#10 wood screws; each screw should be fastened to a wall stud. If a wall stud is unavailable, install an anchor appropriate for a 1-1/2,"#10 screw.

NOTE: The customer is responsible for the correct selection and use of mounting hardware (available through hardware stores) that will ensure the proper and safe wall-mounting of the speakers.

Step 1.

Mark the positions on the wall where you would like to place the mounting screws.

Step 2.

Place bracket against wall and fasten four 1-1/2,"#10 wood screws through the bracket's screw holes into the wall. If a wall stud is not available, use an appropriate anchor.

Step 3.

Screw the post of the bracket into the 1/4"-20 threaded insert on the back of the satellite. Adjust the satellite to the desired angle and tighten the knob.




Figure 3. Bracket on wall.


SATELLITE SPEAKER CONNECTIONS

Turn Off All Power


After placing the speakers, you are ready to connect your system. First, turn off all audio-system power. Use high-quality CL2/3 rated speaker wire for in wall wire runs. #18-Gauge speaker wire with polarity coding is included for outside the wall use only. For longer distances, #16-gauge or heavier wire is recommended. The side of the wire with a ridge or other coding is usually considered positive polarity (i.e., +). Also, consult the owner's manuals that were included with your amplifier or receiver to confirm connection procedures.

Observe polarities when making speaker connections, as shown in Figure 4. Connect each + terminal on the back of the amplifier or receiver to the respective + (red) terminal on each speaker. Connect the – (black) terminals in the same way.



DOLBY* DIGITAL OR DTS[®] (OR OTHER DIGITAL SURROUND MODE) CONNECTION



Use this installation method for Dolby Digital, DTS or other digital surround processors:

Use the line-level input jack marked "LFE" for the Low-Frequency Effects channel. Connect this jack to the LFE output or subwoofer output on your receiver or amplifier. Connect each speaker to the corresponding speaker terminals on your receiver or amplifier.

NOTE: If your receiver or amplifier only has one subwoofer output jack, then you will need to use a Y-connector (not included). Plug the male end of the Y-connector into your receiver or amplifier's subwoofer output jack, and connect each of the two female ends to separate RCA-type interconnects. Finally, plug the RCA-type interconnects into the linelevel inputs on the subwoofer.

Connect each speaker to the corresponding speaker terminals on your receiver or amplifier.

Make sure your receiver or processor is correctly configured to indicate that the subwoofer is "On."


Note for advanced users: If your receiver/processor has a built-in low-pass crossover filter for the subwoofer output, you may use the LFE input to bypass the subwoofer's internal crossover.

DOLBY PRO LOGIC (NON-DIGITAL) - SPEAKER LEVEL

Use this installation method for Dolby Pro Logic applications (not Dolby Digital, DTS or other digital processing), where the receiver/processor does not have a subwoofer output, or a volume-controlled preamp (line-) level output:

Connect your receiver or amplifier's front left and right speaker terminals to the left and right terminals on the subwoofer that are marked "Speaker Level In." Connect the left and right terminals on the subwoofer that are marked "Speaker Level Out" to the corresponding terminals on the back of your front left and right speakers.






If you will be away from home for an extended period of time, or if the subwoofer will not be used, switch the Master Power switch () to the Off position.

TROUBLESHOOTING

If there is no sound from any of the speakers:

• Check that receiver/amplifier is on and a source is playing.

Check that the powered subwoofer is plugged in, and its Power switch (a) is switched on ("•" position).
Check all wires and connections between receiver/amplifier and speakers. Make sure all wires are connected. Make sure none of the speaker wires are frayed, cut or punctured, or touching each other.

• Review proper operation of your receiver/amplifier.

If there is no sound coming from one speaker:

• Check the "Balance" control on your receiver/amplifier.

• Check all wires and connections between receiver/ amplifier and speakers. Make sure all wires are connected. Make sure none of the speaker wires are frayed, cut or punctured, or touching each other.

• In Dolby Digital or DTS modes, make sure that the receiver/processor is configured so that the speaker in question is enabled.

• Turn off all electronics and switch the speaker in question with one of the other speakers that is working correctly. Turn everything back on, and determine whether the problem has followed the speaker, or has remained in the same channel. If the problem is in the same channel, the source of the problem is most likely with your receiver or amplifier, and you should consult the owner's manual for that product for further information. If the problem has followed the speaker, consult your dealer for further assistance.

If there is no sound from the center speaker:

• Check all wires and connections between receiver/ amplifier and speaker. Make sure all wires are connected. Make sure none of the speaker wires are frayed, cut or punctured, or touching each other.

• If your receiver/processor is set in Dolby Pro Logic mode, make sure the center speaker is not in phantom mode.

• If your receiver/processor is set in one of the Dolby Digital or DTS modes, make sure the receiver/processor is configured so that the center speaker is enabled.

If the system plays at low volumes but shuts off as volume is increased:

• Check all wires and connections between receiver/ amplifier and speakers. Make sure all wires are connected. Make sure none of the speaker wires are frayed, cut or punctured, or touching each other.

 If more than one pair of main speakers is being used, check the minimum impedance requirements of your receiver/amplifier.

If there is low (or no) bass output:

- Make sure the connections to the left and right "Speaker Inputs" have the correct polarity (+ and –).
- Make sure the subwoofer is plugged into an active electrical outlet, and is

turned on (Power switch A) in the "•" position).

• In Dolby Digital or DTS modes, make sure your receiver/processor is configured so that the subwoofer and LFE output are enabled.

If there is no sound from the rear speakers:

• Check all wires and connections between receiver/ amplifier and speakers. Make sure all wires are connected. Make sure none of the speaker wires are frayed, cut or punctured, or touching each other.

• Review proper operation of your receiver/amplifier and its surround sound features.

• Make sure the movie or TV show you are watching is recorded in a surround sound mode. If it is not, check to see whether your receiver/amplifier has other surround modes you may use.

• In Dolby Digital or DTS modes, make sure your receiver/processor is configured so that the rear speakers are enabled. When six satellites are in use, remember to configure your receiver or processor for 6.1-channel operation, and when seven satellites are in use, configure your receiver or processor for 7.1 channels.

• Review the operation of your DVD player and the jacket of your DVD to make sure that the DVD features the desired Dolby Digital or DTS mode, and that you have properly selected that mode using both the DVD player's menu and the DVD disc's menu.
